A group education session designed for people with a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease and their carers.

Who runs these sessions?

These education sessions are run by the Parkinson's Advanced Practice Nurse and two Allied Health Professionals from the Brindabella Rehabilitation Service.

What can I expect?

- A brief overview of what Parkinson's disease is and how it affects your brain
- An explanation of 'who does what' in your healthcare team
- Education about how to manage your medicines
- Strategies to help manage your symptoms
- Information about exercises and tools that can help you with daily living
- How to prevent falls
