#### DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (FOI Act), received by Canberra Health Services (CHS) on Tuesday 5 January 2021.

This application requested access to:

'2018 ACT Physicians network's Clinical Examination Review.'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of Canberra Health Services (CHS) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. CHS was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Wednesday 3 February 2021**.

I have identified the document within scope of your access application.

#### **Decisions**

I have decided to grant partial access to the document.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the document released to you is provided as <u>Attachment A</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The views of relevant third parties; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

The identified document contains information that I consider, on balance, to be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

### Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2.1 (a) (i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability;
- Schedule 2.1 (a) (ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest; and
- Schedule 2.1 (a) (iv) ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds.

### Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2.2 (a) (ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004;
- Schedule 2.2 (a) (xii) prejudice an agency's ability to obtain confidential information;
- Schedule 2.2 (a) (xv) prejudice the management function of an agency or the conduct of industrial relations by an agency; and
- Schedule 2.2 (a) (xvii) prejudice the effectiveness of testing or auditing procedures.

Partial redactions have been made to the teaching contributors names contained on pages 13-14 and 16-17 and to participants verbatim comments on pages 22-23 as I believe this constituted an unreasonable disclosure of individuals' personal information. On balance, the factors favouring disclosure did not outweigh the factors favouring non-disclosure as the substantive information has been provided. The release of this information would or could reasonably be expected to have a detrimental effect for the agency's ability to conduct future reviews within the organisation as it may reduce engagement and diminish the honest and truthful participation of staff members completing these feedback requests and the volunteers providing their educational resources. Therefore, I determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and I have decided not to disclose this information.

The ACT Physician Network's Clinical Examination Review was a routine survey of physician trainee satisfaction conducted by the ACT Physician Training Network on the SurveyMonkey platform in September to October 2018, following the release of the Clinical Examination results in late August 2018. The survey was only open to trainees who undertook the Clinical Examination that year and were part of ACT Physician Training Network preparation program. 100% of trainees who were eligible to participate in the survey did so.

Feedback gleaned from the survey was overall positive and constructive in tone. Survey responses were used by the ACT Physician Training Network to improve the training program in subsequent years.

There are some terms in the document that those not familiar with Royal Australasian College of Physicians exams may not know, including:

- Bulldog: a junior physician trainee who acts as an examination assistant; this gives junior trainees exposure to the exam environment before sitting themselves.
- Long case and short case: practical exam preparation.
- Scorpio: an acronym for structured, clinical, objective referenced, problem-based, integrated and organised, used in reference to exam preparation modules.

#### Charges

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.

#### **Disclosure Log**

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, CHS maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. Your personal contact details will not be published.





## Q1 Is this your first attempt at the Clinical Examination?





### Q2 Which hospital were you based in Term 2?





## Q3 Where did you undertake your medical degree?





# Q4 Had you done a physician exam-style LONG case prior to the clinical exam preparation period?





# Q5 Had you done a physician exam-style SHORT case prior to the clinical exam preparation period?





## Q6 Did you bulldog in previous RACP Examinations as a BPT?





## Q7 Had you assisted with Saturday Trial exams at TCH and Calvary in previous years?





## Q8 Did you attend the ArtMed Program at the NGA this year?





## Q9 How many long cases did you present to your assigned mentors?






## Q11 From whom did you receive the most useful feedback for LONG cases? (Please rank the following)


### Q12 How useful did you find the following Scorpios?




# Q13 From whom did you receive the most useful feedback for SHORT cases? (Please rank the following)




### Q15 How useful were the following practice exam sessions?








## Q18 If I had my time again to prepare for the Clinical Exam, I would....
