DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Wednesday 23 June 2021**.

This application requested access to:

'I write to request under the Freedom of Information Act 2016 the vaccine register from the Garran COVID-19 mass vaccination clinic. This request includes, but is not limited to, the register of doses administered, reconstituted, or disposed of, and the number of vaccination appointments booked, conducted and cancelled/missed.'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Wednesday 21 July 2021**.

The information has been extracted into one document holding the information within the scope of your access application. The document was created for the purpose of your request and captures information sourced from the ACT Health Data Repository.

Decisions

I have decided to grant full access to the relevant document. The document released to you are provided at Attachment A to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.

Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, ACTHD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. COVID-19 Vaccination data

Garran COVID-19 mass vaccination clinic:

1. Register of doses administered

To 23 June 2021, all Pfizer doses, in tables 1 and 2 below, have been administered through the Garran mass vaccination clinic.

2. Reconstituted doses

The number of doses prepared for administration (defrosted, diluted and prepared in single dose syringes) and subsequent administration and wastage is monitored daily by Canberra Health Services (CHS).

Numbers of vials prepared varies according to demand (booked appointments).

3. Disposed of

Canberra Health Services (CHS) monitor wastage daily to ensure this is minimal.

A review for the month of June shows that the average wastage is 0.28% for Pfizer vaccine doses. That is, from every 1000 doses, an average of just 2.8 are wasted. The vast majority of this very small amount of wastage is due to the complex handling associated with multi-dose vials, and the fragile nature of the Pfizer vaccine. For example, unlike other vaccines if an air-bubble is present in the syringe it cannot be tapped out.

This wastage rate is very low by benchmark standards. For newly introduced vaccines, the National Partnership on Essential Vaccines sets a baseline of 10% wastage, with the target of achieving a wastage rate of less than 5% over time to meet the benchmark.

Of note, the Commonwealth Government publishes vaccine utilisation rates for each state and Territory and the ACT often leads this nationally.

4. Appointments booked

Conducted

The number of appointments conducted is the number of appointments booked excluding cancellations (Table 3), minus the number of appointments not attended (Table 6).

Please note that the number of appointments conducted does not equal the number of doses administered. This is because doses may be administered by the Garran mass vaccination clinic to patients in hospital or other settings as part of their in-reach activities. Appointments at the Garran clinic generally provide one dose per appointment, however on some occasions more than one dose may be administered where persons with disability are accompanied by a carer. In addition, appointments may be attended but the vaccination dose may not proceed for a range of reasons, including that the person does not wait for their dose to be administered.

6. Cancelled appointments –
