DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by Canberra Health Services (CHS) on **Tuesday 16 August 2022** and rescoped on **Tuesday 30 August 2022**.

This application requested access to:

'Data held by the ACT Equipment Scheme under the Freedom of Information Act. This request relates to data regarding continence products funded by the ACT Equipment Scheme.

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of Canberra Health Services (CHS) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. CHS was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Tuesday 27 September 2022.**

The information within the scope of your access application has been extracted into one document included at <u>Attachment A</u>. This has been created for the purpose of your request and captures information held by CHS.

CHS does not hold data relevant to the specification of identifying if the catheters are coated or uncoated. Therefore, CHS is unable to provide data for columns four and five in the tables of your access application in accordance with Section 35(1)(b).

Decisions on Access

I have decided to grant full access to one document.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request
- The views of relevant third parties and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Charges
