DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Tuesday 20 September 2022.** This application was rescoped on **Monday 26 September 2022.**

The rescoped application requested access to:

"I request all documents / correspondence held by the Ministerial & Governance Services (MAGS) and the Local Health Network (LHN) for Question On Notice 835"

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Tuesday 15 November 2022**.

I have identified 48 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

Decisions on access

I have decided to:

- grant full access to 17 documents; and
- grant partial access to 31 documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The views of relevant third parties; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Full Access

I have decided to grant full access to 17 documents at references 2-5, 7, 11-12, 20-21, 25, 33, 36 and 38-42.

Partial Access

I have decided to grant partial access to 31 documents at references 1, 6, 8-10, 13-19, 22-24, 26-32, 34-35, 37 and 43-48. Redactions have been made to information that I consider, on balance, to be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act as the information contained in these folios are partially comprised of personal information.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability;
- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest;
- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(iv) ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds; and
- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

• Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

On balance, the factors favouring disclosure are outweighed by the factor favouring non-disclosure as the information would not provide any government information pertinent to your request. The personal information is of both ACT-Government and non-ACT Government employees' contact details and has not been disclosed as this could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of the individual's right to privacy. Therefore, I have determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and would not advantage the public in disclosing this information.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.

Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, ACTHD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the FOI Act. 



 - o Monthly rate is calculated by number of incidents/1000000/working hours.
 - Next step involves 12 months rolling numerator and 12 months denominator are calculated for 12 monthly rates.
 - o last set of calculations involves financial year to date/actual rate calculations.
 - o All the calculations are sorted by division and for CHS overall.
 - Once data is sorted in columns on the excel spreadsheet, data is refreshed onto the CHS WHS Lost time and OV Power BI (PBI) report.





- The Occupational Violence (OV) data is obtained from the Staff Incident register on RiskMan.
- With regards to the Lost Time Incident Frequency Rate (LTIFR) we will include this information in our response:
- CHS calculates the LTIFR according to the Safe Work Australia formula. To run the CHS LTIFR report, the following steps are involved:
 - 1. Manually extract lost time incident data reported on the CHS Riskman staff incident register.
 - 2. Data is manually sorted for two categories Work Health Safety (WHS) all staff incidents and for Occupational Violence (OV) incidents by CHS division.
 - 3. Payroll data is extracted from the CHS monthly payroll (which is generated via CHRIS 21).
 - 4. Data is manually sorted i.e. FTE count by Branch and total CHS FTE count.
 - 5. To conduct qualitative and quantitative analysis, following steps are taken for calculation:
 - o FTE count payroll and Riskman lost time both data sets are sorted by division
 - For calculating working hours, Safe Work Australia Formula Lost time injury frequency rates | Safe Work Australia is applied to data i.e., FTE count multiply by Number of work week (3.75*)and multiply by hours worked per week
 - o Monthly rate is calculated by number of incidents/1000000/working hours.
 - Next step involves 12 months rolling numerator and 12 months denominator are calculated for 12 monthly rates.
 - o last set of calculations involves financial year to date/actual rate calculations.
 - All the calculations are sorted by division and for CHS overall.
 - Once data is sorted in columns on the excel spreadsheet, data is refreshed onto the CHS WHS Lost time and OV Power BI (PBI) report.







The data provided at question 10 was the number of incidents resulting in lost time for each mechanism of injury classification for the financial year. The number of incidents provided in question 10 will not show the LTIFR for each mechanism of injury as Calvary are unable to "drill down" to mechanisms of injury LTIFR.







There is a comment from Meg at the response to Q3, however, this is not the response that ACTHD provided to CHS (also attached). On further review, it looks like there have been changes to the ACTHD input in the version that went to MO.

Meg has said 'This seems inconsistent with response to 2 that CPHB don't use LTIFR so what is the utility of then providing this information.' However, our input did not say that CPHB do not use LTIFR, it stated that CPHB do not measure or report on LTIFR by incident classification. I think if the response is changed back to what we originally provided it will make more sense – Can you have a look and discuss with Kerryn?

Ryan has also said below 'Minister's questions haven't been answered, and it seems like its mostly due to Calvary.' On my reading of the comments, the only comment relating to Calvary input it at Q3, so I'm not sure if they are expecting us to review any of the other input but I don't think we need to. **Would appreciate a sense check from** you please.
