DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by the ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Friday 08 December 2023**.

This application requested access to:

'All communications including attachments and documents between the Ministerial and Governance Service and the Ministers office regarding Question on Notice 44 to the Standing Committee on Health and Community Wellbeing that was signed off on the 5/12/23. <u>Microsoft Word - Response to QON 44 (act.gov.au)</u>'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACTHD under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Tuesday 30 January 2024**.

I have identified three documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

Decisions

I have decided to:

- grant full access to two documents; and
- grant partial access to one document

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Full Access

I have decided to grant full access to the documents at references: 2-3.

Partial Access

I have decided to grant partial access to the document at reference: 1.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability; and
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

• Schedule 2, 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the Human Rights Act 2004.

On balance, the factors favouring disclosure did not outweigh the factor favouring non-disclosure as the redacted information contains mobile phone numbers ACT Government employees. Therefore, I determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and I have decided not to disclose this information.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.

Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, ACTHD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. Your personal contact details will not be published.

Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the FOI Act. (1) How many times did the Director-General of the Health Directorate make a final 'delegate' procurement decision, in the financial years 2018-19 to 2022-23?

Minister Rachel Stephen-Smith MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

To determine how many times the Director-General was the final 'delegate' in a procurement decision, noting in most circumstances they are not the delegate, would require review of every procurement file in the electronic document record management system over the requested time period, to determine who the delegate was for each matter. The information requested is not readily available and to produce the information, it would be an unreasonable diversion of directorate resources.
