#### DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Monday 15 April 2024**.

This application requested access to:

'All documents, including emails, text and Whatsapp messages, etc, relating to Minister Davidson's refusal to sign a letter to schools about the issue of vaping among young children, which was signed by other federal and territory ministers.'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Thursday 20 June 2024**.

I have identified 3 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

#### Decisions

I have decided to:

- grant full access to one document; and
- grant partial access to 2 documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The views of relevant third parties; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

#### Full Access

I have decided to grant full access to the document at reference 2.

#### Partial Access

Documents at references 1 and 3 are partially comprised of information that I consider is personal information containing mobile phone numbers of ACT Government employees as well as personal

details of non-ACT Government employees. This information has not been disclosed as this could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of the individual's right to privacy.

#### Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability; and
- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.

#### Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

• Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.

On balance, the factors favouring disclosure are outweighed by the factor favouring non-disclosure as the information would not provide any government information pertinent to your request. Therefore, I have determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and would not advantage the public in disclosing this information.

#### **Charges**

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.

#### **Disclosure Log**

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, ACTHD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. #### **Ombudsman review**

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the FOI Act. You have the right to seek Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in ACT Health's disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.

Is the below something you would potentially be able to talk to Loi about?

The Commonwealth has prepared a template letter to be sent in each jurisdiction to school principals about vaping, cosigned by Commonwealth and local Health and Education Ministers. We provided (urgent) input on this a couple of weeks back and have still not seen a final version of the letter.

DLO now advises the MO will not be cosigning and the reasoning below doesn't quite make sense – I understand all relevant jurisdictional Ministers will be cosigning their version and a bit concerned about us being out of step/missing an opportunity for Minister Davidson to advocate from a health perspective about this issue to a pretty important group of stakeholders. I also have a copy of the NSW letter (not for further distribution) and confirm it's cosigned by all (four) relevant Ministers.

## Australian Government



**Dear Principal** 

We are writing to you about the rising issue of vaping among young Australians, particularly in schools. Vaping poses a serious threat to the health and wellbeing of our students.

Statistics show that one in seven 14–17-year-olds and one in five 18–24-year-olds vape regularly, putting their brain development and future health at risk. In addition, young vapers are three times more likely to take up tobacco smoking, perpetuating a cycle of addiction.

That's why we are proudly partnering across Federal, State and Territory governments on urgent action to stop vapes getting into the hands of students, and to support them to quit vaping.

We have already begun taking decisive action. Starting in 2024, a series of reforms will be implemented:

- Import bans: The importation of single use vapes was banned on 1 January 2024, and the importation of all non-therapeutic vapes will be banned by March 2024. This closes the loophole allowing these harmful products into the hands of our youth.
- Stricter regulations and enforcement: From July 2024, therapeutic vapes will have limited flavours, reduced nicotine, and pharmaceutical packaging. Marketing tactics targeting young people will be banned. Strengthened laws will make it harder to sell illegal products.
- Support for quitting: \$29.5 million will be allocated for quitting resources, including an online hub and mobile app.

In addition to these national reforms, the ACT has developed curriculum resources and professional learning for year 7 and 8 teachers to support education about e-cigarettes and the associated risks. These resources are available via the Education Directorate's <u>Service</u> <u>Portal</u> that is accessible to all teaching staff. Resources for year 5 and 6 will also be developed and available in semester 2, 2024.

National resources like the Student Wellbeing Hub can also assist schools to educate students about the dangers of vaping, in line with the national curriculum.

We encourage schools to direct students seeking help to access Quitline by telephone on 13 78 48 or via their website at <u>www.guit.org.au</u>. For suspected nicotine dependence, you may wish to advise families to consult their GP, who can prescribe age-appropriate cessation solutions.

Our shared commitment is to provide a safe learning environment and protect our future generation from this public health threat.

Please be assured our governments stand with you in this fight. Together, we can keep our schools vape-free and our students healthy.
