### **DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION**

I refer to your application under Section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on **Tuesday 25 January 2022**.

This application requested access to:

'The evidence base used to make the decision that ACT secondary school students wear face masks in school in term 1 of 2022. In particular, I'm interested in evidence that cloth and surgical masks (the kinds worn by students), reduce transmission of Covid-19.

There have been more than a dozen Randomised Controlled Trials on surgical and/or cloth masks to determine whether these masks reduce the incidence of Influenza-like Illnesses and none of these have found any statistically significant benefit. These include several RCTs by Australia's own Professor Raina Macintyre.

It is clear from observational data around the world that masks are not suppressing transmission of Covid. For example, Austria, Belgium, France, Spain, Germany are experiencing record infections, despite mask mandates. In fact many of these countries have move to mandate medical-grade masks (N95), such is the ineffectiveness of cloth and surgical masks.

For an intervention such as wearing a mask for 6 hours a day, there must be compelling evidence that this will be of benefit in reducing the spread of Covid. It is in the public interest to know this as masks are uncomfortable, they obscure facial expression and can cause hypercapnia. I would like to be assured that there is sound scientific basis for the decision and that the masks are not just being used as talismans'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under Section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Wednesday 23 February 2022**.

### **Decisions**

ACTHD does not hold documents relevant to the scope of your application in accordance with Section 35(1)(b).

As the ACT continues to experience a higher level of community transmission, public health measures to reduce transmission in school settings are essential to protect students and staff, including those that are outlined in the ACT Government's *Health Guidelines for Schools and Early Childhood Education and Care (including out of school hours care)*.

Mask-wearing is one suggested risk mitigation, in addition to check in requirements for staff and visitors, physical distancing, good hand and respiratory hygiene, regular cleaning and disinfecting, ventilation, and the continued advice for students to stay home if they are unwell. The Guidelines have been informed by advice from the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee regarding COVID-19 in schools, and mask-wearing in general.
