DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by Canberra Health Services (CHS) on **Wednesday 26 April 2023**.

This application requested access to:

'All documents relating to the decision to contract out Medical and Sonography Services by Canberra Health Services, including documents relating to:

- the decision to contract out these services
- the decision about how to call for proposals
- all communication with the Health Minister and her office about the above, up until today's date, and all documents held by her office about the above'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of Canberra Health Services (CHS) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. CHS was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Friday 16 June 2023**.

I have identified 12 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

Decisions on access

I have decided to:

- grant full access to relevant information in four documents;
- refuse access to one document; and
- grant partial access to seven documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
- The views of relevant third parties; and
- The Human Rights Act 2004.

Full Access

I have decided to grant full access to the information in scope of your application within four documents at references 2, 7, and 10-11.

Refuse Access

I have decided to refuse access to one document at reference 5. The document is wholly comprised of information classified as legal information, and under Schedule 1.2 Information subject to legal professional privilege, it is taken to be contrary to the public interest to release.

Partial Access

I have decided to grant partial access to seven documents at references 1, 3-4, 6, 8-9 and 12 as they contain information that I consider, on balance, to be contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the FOI Act.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability; and
- Schedule 2, 2.1(a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*; and
- Schedule 2, 2.2 (a)(xiii) prejudice the competitive commercial activities of an agency.

Documents at references 1, 6, 8-9 and 12 have redactions to personal information such as mobile numbers and email addresses of ACT Government employees and non-ACT Government employees that has not been disclosed as this could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of the individual's right to privacy.

Documents at references 3 and 4 are partially comprised of information that would prejudice the competitive commercial activities of an agency.

On balance, the factors favouring disclosure were outweighed by the factors favouring nondisclosure as I have determined that the information would be expected to prejudice both involved individuals' right to privacy and the competitive commercial activities, therefore I determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and I have decided not to disclose this information.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable to this request.


Dear Boon

The ITP trainees are currently not getting any structured ultrasound training. I am also unsure who is our current ultrasound coordinator. The registrars tell me the sonographers are too busy to teach them to scan. Year 1 and year 2 registrars are supposed to be rostered one session per week of ultrasound to enable them to get their IHCA in ultrasound signed off at CHWC, this has not happened for 2022.

There is currently a loose agreement between Canberra Fetal Assessment Centre and CHWC to have one registrar attend CFAC every Monday afternoon for ultrasound training. Although this does not cover all our training requirements it is better than none. CFAC is now requesting an MOU between CFAC and CHWC to formalise the arrangement of registrar ultrasound teaching. I would be grateful if you can facilitate that. In order to fulfil our registrars' training requirement, I would recommend CFAC offers two formal registrar learning sessions a week for the next 12 months until a hospital ultrasound coordinator is reappointed and the number of experienced FMU sonographers recovers.

Purpose

To seek approval from the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), or authorised delegate, for an exemption from Section 9 (Procurements of \$200,000 or more requiring public tender) of the Government Procurement Regulation 2007 (the Regulation) to procure The Fetal Medicine Unit (FMU) Services. The cost of this procurement proposal is estimated to b

Background

The FMU provides care for people with complex or high risk pregnancies, who need specialized care for either themselves or their baby. FMU has sustained critical staffing shortages for the last 12 months. It is anticipated that these will worsen from late February 2023. WYC have conducted multiple rounds of recruitment, through external agencies to fill the vacant roles. WYC are currently providing a service through visiting medical officers and partial cover of existing medical staff.

Regulation Requirements

Section 10 of the Regulation, *Procurement of goods, services or works—exemption from quotation and tender requirements,* states:

(1) The responsible chief executive officer for a territory entity may, in writing, exempt the entity from a requirement mentioned in section 6 or section 9 for a particular procurement proposal.

Note **Responsible chief executive officer**—see the Act, dictionary.

(2) However, the responsible chief executive officer may exempt the entity only if satisfied, on reasonable grounds, that the benefit of the exemption outweighs the benefit of compliance with the requirement.

Examples-when exemption may be given

- 1 only 1, or a limited number of, suppliers is available because of a need to buy equipment that is compatible with existing equipment, or because of a supplier's specialist knowledge
- 2 only 1 supplier can supply a particular good or service
- *3* standardisation of a product is agreed after public tenders are called for the original equipment
- 4 the time within which a particular procurement activity must be completed prevents public tenders being called
- 5 where a secondary objective of the procurement is to achieve an appreciable social or community benefit
- 6 the procurement is through a common use agreement established in another jurisdiction.
- (3) If the responsible chief executive officer exempts an entity, the chief executive officer may, in writing, direct the entity to do 1 or more of the following:
 - (a) seek a stated kind or number of quotations for the procurement;
 - (b) invite a tender from a stated supplier for the procurement.
- (4) An exemption must state—
 - (a) the procurement proposal to which it applies; and
 - *(b) the responsible chief executive officer's reasons for giving the exemption; and*
 - (c) any direction to which it is subject under subsection (3).

Fair Trade Agreements allow for limited tendering for covered procurements (what the ACT Government sometimes terms 'select' or 'single select' tendering) only in certain circumstances (refer to this link for circumstances <u>Australian-Free-Trade-Agreements-Factsheet.pdf</u>). The circumstances that are applicable to this procurement are:

15.10 (b) iii) The good or service can be supplied only by a particular supplier and no reasonable alternative or substitute good or service exists due to an absence of competition for technical reasons; and

15.10 (i) in so far as is strictly necessary if, for reasons of extreme urgency brought about by events unforeseeable by the procuring entity, the good or service could not be obtained in time by means of open or selective tendering.

There are a limited number of fetal medicine specialists, with knowledge and ability to provide the service. There is currently only one private provider in the Territory and timely action must be taken to ensure continued service provision.

Exemption Justification

This procurement proposal is unable to fulfill the quotation and tender requirements of the Regulation as the time within which a particular procurement activity must be completed prevents public tenders being called. It is proposed that a select tender process with the identified suppliers and an evaluation for value for money be completed for this procurement.

The approach is to attract more than one vendor, if the approach is unable to engage more than one Vendor it will proceed as a Single Select with the Vendor.

To maximise the administrative efficiency, it is proposed that this exemption be approved for the Short term contract term for the FMU services of 12 months with possibility of extension for further 12 months.

Background

The FMU provides care for people with complex or high risk pregnancies, who need specialized care for either themselves or their baby. FMU has sustained critical staffing shortages for the last 12 months. It is anticipated that these will worsen from late February 2023. WYC have conducted multiple rounds of recruitment, through external agencies to fill the vacant roles. WYC are currently providing a service through visiting medical officers and partial cover of existing medical staff.

Section 10 of the Regulation, *Procurement of goods, services or works—exemption from quotation and tender requirements*, states:

- (3) If the responsible chief executive officer exempts an entity, the chief executive officer may, in writing, direct the entity to do 1 or more of the following:
 - (a) seek a stated kind or number of quotations for the procurement;
 - (b) invite a tender from a stated supplier for the procurement.
- (4) An exemption must state—
 - (a) the procurement proposal to which it applies; and
 - *(b)* the responsible chief executive officer's reasons for giving the exemption; and
 - (c) any direction to which it is subject under subsection (3).

As CFAC have indicated that they can no longer support ultrasound training for our registrars, I have been in discussions with Dr Deb Nisbet, Chair of the COGU Subcommittee of RANZCOG about this issue. She has put me in touch with a number of CMFM, COGU and DDUs from Melbourne who have indicated their interest to come to do some hands on training sessions with the registrars. The plan is that they will come either on Tuesday or Thursday, once a week and have a registrar rostered to the ultrasound session with them, so that they can provide direct hands on supervision. I anticipate that by doing this for 6 months, all the registrars would have satisfied their training requirements and have their APSS signed off. This will also guarantee that the registrars will get the appropriate level of supervision they need.

Tuesdays and Thursdays would be ideal because although they are meant to be 'low risk' days, they can also help to deal with any unexpected problem that arises.
