DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) on Thursday 9 November 2023, and rescoped on **Wednesday 29 November 2023**.

This application requested access to:

'All documents, including communications, held by the ACT Health Communications and Engagement team from 18 September 2023 to 28 November 2023 regarding media requests or media reporting from any media outlet about or mentioning an alleged stabbing at the Australian National University on 18 September 2023.

• This includes but is not limited to emails, slack messages and internal documents.

All ministerial briefings, held by the ACT Health about or mentioning leave policies at the Garrangawal Mental Health Facility or Dhulwa Mental Health Facility or the alleged stabbing at the Australian National University on September 18 2023 for the period of 18 September 2023 to 28 November 2023.'

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General of ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. ACTHD was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Friday 9 February 2024**.

I have identified 47 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at <u>Attachment A</u> to this decision letter.

Decisions

I have decided to:

- grant full access to six documents; and
- grant partial access to 41 documents.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as <u>Attachment B</u> to this letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act;
- The contents of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;

Disclosure Log

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, ACTHD maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. The scope of your access application, my decision and documents released to you will be published in the disclosure log not less than three days but not more than 10 days after the date of this decision. 

Services and supervision provided to an individual would depend on what is clinically appropriate and necessary. Conditions imposed by the ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal and the type of order made by the tribunal under the Mental Health Act 2015 also determine any additional supervision requirements.

<mark>For example,</mark> a Court may order that a person be detained in custody for immediate review by ACAT <mark>under section</mark> <mark>180 of the Act.</mark>

In reviewing the detention of a person, the ACAT must evaluate whether a person presents a danger to society as a result of their mental condition. The ACAT must consider the nature and extent of the person's mental disorder or mental illness, whether the person would be at risk to themselves or others if released, and the views of any affected person and the victims of crime commissioner, with the view that detention in custody is to be regarded as a last resort.

The ACAT must consider the release of the person no later than 7 days after the day of the order. If the ACAT orders the release of a person, the ACAT may impose any conditions it considers appropriate, including a requirement to comply with a mental health order (MHO) or a forensic mental health order (FMHO).

If the ACAT does not order the release of the person, it may make MHOs or FMHOs in relation to the person, and must review their detention at least monthly.



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

The incident that occurred at the Australian National University (ANU) this week is distressing. Our thoughts are with the students that were injured and their families and close friends.

The Chief Minister, the Attorney-General, the Minister for Police and Emergency Services and the Minister for Mental Health received a briefing this morning from the Chief Police Officer and officials from Canberra Health Services.

The ACT's Chief Psychiatrist will undertake a review into the individual circumstances surrounding the incident.

Subject to the outcomes of the Chief Psychiatrist's review and any recommendations for systemic change, the Government will convene a dedicated working group to provide advice on matters arising.

Given the ongoing criminal proceedings, and the laws that prohibit the disclosure of personal medical information, the Government is limited in what information can be made public. However we will inform the community about aspects that relate to process and public safety.

The Government recognises that many students and staff at the University will also be feeling vulnerable and distressed by this incident. The Chief Minister met with ANU Vice Chancellor Brian Schmidt this morning and offered support to the University.

Canberra is a safe city, and incidents like this are rare. The Government would like to reassure students and staff at ANU that there is no ongoing threat to their safety, and they should feel confident to move around the campus.

Ministers would also like to recognise the response from ACT Police, ACT Emergency Services and ANU security to the incident and their support for witnesses at the scene.





Background

- The ACT Government has announced that the Chief Psychiatrist will initiate a review into the circumstances leading to the incident at Australian National University (ANU) on 18 September 2023 involving Mr Alex Ophel.
- The purpose of this brief is to propose the scope and outline options to undertake such a review.

Issues

3. It is appropriate that the scope of this review is to examine:

Clinical review

- a. Whether Mr Ophel received appropriate care and necessary processes were in place to manage risks. Exploration may include ongoing clinical risk assessments, care and treatment received by Mr Ophel, and clinical decisions made to manage any risks during periods of approved leave.
- b. Whether there was any change Mr Ophel's clinical presentation or circumstances in the period leading up to this incident that would have suggested a need for a change in clinical management.
- c. Whether policies and processes in place on 18 September 2023 were adequate or could be improved to alert relevant persons/organisations of the risk and better identify and address similar risks.

Chief psychiatrist's expanded -literature-review

- d. From the review of clinical documentation, the Chief Psychiatrist will consider whether relevant information about Mr Ophel's clinical care needs, clinical risks, treatment and rehabilitation aspects was explicitly and appropriately provided to assist decision-making to determine Mr Ophel's clinical management.
- d.e. <u>More generally, whether d</u> Decision making and clinical care provision to ensure the best possible mental health care to people who have been deemed not guilty by reasons of mental impairment while integrating broader community safety considerations into decisionmaking.
- Three options for progressing the review were considered. Their merits and limitations are outlined in the table at <u>Attachment A</u>. Option three is proposed as a preferred option.
- 5. The review will be undertaken in two parts:

- A clinical review by a clinical review panel to specifically focus on 3a to 3c (above). This review will be completed by 12 December 2023.
- b. A Chief Psychiatrist's expanded review to provide you with an opinion and recommendations in relation to 3d and 3e above. It is anticipated that an interim opinion about 3d should be able to be provided to you by the end of 2023 and about 3ethis review will be completed by 1 February 2024
- The draft Terms of Reference (<u>Attachment B</u>) outline the proposed direction for <u>the</u> clinical review.
- There are two options for the clinical review component. The merits and benefits of the two options are at <u>Attachment B.</u>
 - a. The first option is to progress a clinical review under the provisions of a Quality Assurance Committee (QAC) under Section 27 of the Health Act 1993. A review under QAC provisions will also enable sharing of information by clinicians and health services with confidence that any information provided will be confidential, they will not be personally liable for anything done or omitted to be done honestly and without recklessness and the information shared will be used to facilitate the improvement of health services provided in the ACT.
 - <u>a.</u> The second option for the clinical review is without QAC provisions The first option is to progress a clinical review under the provisions of a Quality Assurance Committee (QAC) under section 27 of the *Health Act 1993*. A review under QAC provisions will allow the QAC to ask anyone to give it any information that is relevant to the QAC carrying out its functions. Information provided to the QAC in response to a request for information, so long as it is done honestly and without recklessness will not be a breach of confidence, a breach of professional etiquette or ethics, a breach of a rule of professional conduct and will not result in the person providing the information incurring civil or criminal liability because of the giving of the information.
 - b. The second option for the clinical review is that it be undertaken by the Chief Psychiatrist as a quality assurance/incident review exercise without reliance on the QAC provisions in the *Health Act 1993*.
- h.

8. It is proposed that the clinical review is undertaken by a Special Purpose QAC under the *Health Act*, 1993. The Chief Psychiatrist, a Forensic Psychiatrist external to the ACT with experience of managing provision of inpatient mental health care to people who have been deemed not guilty by reasons for mental impairment, a forensic mental health nurse external to the ACT, a carer representative and a consumer representative will form the clinical review panel.

8-9. The two experts external to the ACT are proposed to increase the independence of the clinical review, noting that it will examine decisions made by Tracking No.: MIN23/Tracking No.: MIN23/Tracking No.: MIN23/

delegates of the Chief Psychiatrist and this will help address any perceptions of potential conflict of interest as the Chief Psychiatrist is on the Special Purpose QAC and leading the review of the incident.

9.10. For the Chief Psychiatrist's expanded review, the Chief Psychiatrist will be supported by suitable academic and legal expert/s with Mental Health Tribunal and Human Rights expertise. The Justice and Community Safety Directorate and the ACT Government Solicitor will be approached to identify these expert/s. It is likely that these experts will be from interstate. Terms of reference for the expanded review and format for reporting will be developed in due course. You will be briefed regularly during the review process. There will be limitations on disclosures that can be made by you of personal or personal health information relating to Mr Ophel and any other individuals given the restrictions in the *Health Act 1993, Health Records (Privacy and Access) Act 1997* and the *Information Privacy Act 2014*. However, any general recommendations or observations that are made by either review which do not involve the disclosure of personal or personal health information will not be the subject of restrictions on disclosure.

<u>10.11.</u> You will be briefed regularly during the review process and briefings can be provided to other Ministers as directed.

Financial Implications

- 11.12. Provided option three is supported, the following resources have been allocated to the review:
 - a. Appointment of an Acting Director, Special Project reporting to the Director, Office of Chief Psychiatrist for a period of three months.
 - b. Resources to support a commissioned literature review of best practice in legislative frameworks and implementation approaches to manage ongoing care and treatment of an individual considered by court to be not guilty because by reasons of mental impairment.
 - c. Payment to external experts including a forensic psychiatrist, forensic mental health nurse, academic and legal experts with Mental Health Tribunal and Human Rights expertise, carer representative and consumer representative.
 - d. Appropriate personnel from the ACT Health Directorate Clinical System Governance Unit and Canberra Health Service Quality and Safety Units will provide methodology support to the review panel to undertake the clinical review.
 - e. The Chief Medical Officer's Executive Assistant will support administrative functions related to the review.

- An independent expert forensic psychiatrist (external to the ACT) will be invited to join the review panel to provide independent expert advice.
- A forensic mental health nurse (internal or external to the ACT)
- A mental health consumer and a mental health carer with lived experience will be invited to join the review panel to provide their perspective to the review.

Methodology of Review

Root Cause Analysis, a robust, independent, consistently validated and internationally recognised process will be used.

Any information, particularly patient health information, utilised during the review will be managed with sensitivity. Those that come into contact with sensitive information will require a firm understanding of the QAC structure and requirements and legal obligations of accessing, distributing and storing information under the Health Records (Privacy & Access) Act 1997 and the Information Privacy Act 2014.

The Review Panel will interview relevant persons and complete a report.

Roles and responsibilities

Chief Psychiatrist will

 Lead the clinical review and support the panel to consider matters identified in the Purpose (above) to facilitate the improvement of health services provided in the ACT.

Acting Director, Special Project, Office of Chief Psychiatrist will



- I acknowledge the distress that the events at ANU on 18 September have caused to the people involved in the incident and to the wider community.
- I would like to assure the ACT community that a comprehensive review is underway and will include:
 - A clinical review
 - An expanded review by the Chief Psychiatrist to consider best practice for mental health services (including leave approval) to manage individuals found not guilty due to a mental impairment (NGMI) by the courts and transferred from custody into the care of mental health services.

Notable key achievements to date:

- Formation of the Special Purpose Quality Assurance Committee (QAC) Clinical Review Panel Membership which includes experts from outside the ACT in the following fields:
 - A Forensic Psychiatrist from Victoria
 - A Forensic Mental Health Nurse from Queensland
 - A consumer advocate from Victoria
- Appropriate experts with expertise in forensic practice and mental health law are currently being sought to inform the Chief Psychiatrist's expanded review.

Methodology used for the Clinical Review:

 The Root Cause Analysis (RCA) process is an independent, internationally recognised and validated process that will be used to identify any possible systems issues that can be improved.

Methodology used for the Chief Psychiatrist's Expanded Review:

- The Chief Psychiatrist and experts engaged for this part of the review will meet with relevant stakeholders to understand their perspectives. The external experts will also provide best practice advice to the Chief Psychiatrist from a review of processes in other jurisdictions and research. The QAC Clinical Review Panel may invite them to provide information under the confidentiality and privacy provisions of a QAC. There will also be an opportunity for stakeholders to provide their perspectives directly to the Chief Psychiatrist as part of his expanded review.
- Q: Will the people injured by the alleged assailant, or their families be included in the review process?
- A: The QAC Clinical Review Panel will determine who they will need to meet with to complete the clinical review.

A review into the distressing events which occurred at ANU on 18 September, which will be led by the ACT's Chief Psychiatrist, has now commenced. This comprehensive review includes two key components:

- A clinical review, with a focus on the incident on 18 September.
- An expanded review, with a focus on best practice for mental health services to manage individuals found not guilty due to a mental impairment by the courts and transferred from custody into the care of mental health services.

The clinical review will be undertaken by a Special Purpose Quality Assurance Committee (QAC). Membership of the Clinical Review Panel includes experts from outside the ACT, including:

- A Forensic Psychiatrist from Victoria
- A Forensic Mental Health Nurse from Queensland
- A consumer advocate from Victoria

The Chief Psychiatrist's expanded review will similarly include experts in forensic practice and mental health law, and its membership will be finalised shortly. The Chief Psychiatrist will seek input from a variety of relevant stakeholders to understand their perspectives, which may include police, ambulance and carers.

Emma Davidson, Minister for Mental Health welcomed the establishment of the Chief Psychiatrist's review:
